Aesthetic Surgery services can range from the rhinoplasty (nose lift), blepharoplasty (eyelid surgery), chin augmentation, otoplasty (ear surgery), lip surgery, inflation/removal of tissue expander, suction lipectomy and auto-fat injection.

established an academic partnership with an internationally accredited institute on technology, the Technological Institute of the Philippines (TIP). This partnership is intended to establish a venue and a forum for brainstorming and research conceptualization leading to various proposals; assist each other in the development of research projects related to each other's expertise and capabilities, partner and collaborate with each other on relevant research projects; and search and apply for research grants from reputable funding agencies.
